On the occasion of World Environment Day, the NSS Unit of GMR Institute of Technology (GMRIT), Rajam, organized an Awareness Rally on Environment Protection on 5th June 2024. The aim of the rally was to spread awareness about the importance of protecting the environment and to encourage eco-friendly habits in the community. The rally started from the GMRIT campus and moved through Dolapeta, Rajam, with students carrying placards and shouting slogans on saving nature, reducing pollution, and avoiding plastic use. Dr. C.L.V.R.S.V. Prasad, Principal of GMRIT, attended the event as Chief Guest and addressed the participants, highlighting the importance of working together to protect our environment. #### **Day-wise Activity Report: Day-1: 17.09.2024 - Inauguration of the Event**

The Swachhta Hi Seva Campaign 2024 commenced with a strong focus on cleanliness and environmental sustainability, following the theme "Swabhav Swachhata - Sanskaar Swachhata." The campaign, running from 17th September to 1st October 2024, began with the formal Swachhta Pledge and a plantation drive titled "Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam," aimed at promoting community participation and environmental responsibility. 
## **Day-7: 23.09.2024 – Creating Awareness & collection of Single-Use Plastic**

The campaign titled "Choose to Refuse" aims to raise awareness about the pervasive nature of single-use plastics and encourage individuals and communities to adopt more sustainable practices. Single-use plastics, such as bags, straws, and water bottles, are designed to be used once and discarded. This convenience comes at a considerable environmental cost. According to the United Nations, an estimated 300 million tons of plastic are produced each year, with a significant portion ending up in oceans and landfills. These plastics take hundreds of years to decompose, leading to widespread pollution that harms wildlife and disrupts ecosystems. Marine animals often mistake plastic for food, resulting in ingestion that can be fatal. Furthermore, micro plastics—tiny plastic particles resulting from the breakdown of larger items—have infiltrated our food and water supply, raising concerns about human health.



## **Day-10: 26.09.2024 - Awareness Programme on Types of Plastic, Dangers of Single Use Plastic**

On the tenth day of the Swachhta Hi Seva Campaign, held on 26th September 2024, the NSS Unit of GMRIT, Rajam, organized an Awareness Campaign on Single-Use Plastic. This initiative aimed to address the escalating environmental and health concerns posed by single-use plastics and educate participants about their harmful impacts. The program began with an introduction to the different types of plastics, highlighting their characteristics, common uses, and associated dangers. ### Report on Swachh Andhra – Swachh Diwas Programme

As part of the Swachh Andhra – Swachh Diwas Programme, a monthly cleanliness initiative launched by the Government of Andhra Pradesh, the NSS Unit of GMR Institute of Technology, Rajam, organized an awareness campaign on 15th March 2025 at Dolapeta village. The programme is observed on the third Saturday of every month with a focused theme. ## **Free Eye Screening Camp, Basic Life Support & CPR Training**

As part of the Swachh Andhra – Swachh Diwas Programme, a monthly initiative launched by the Government of Andhra Pradesh, the NSS Unit of GMR Institute of Technology, Rajam organized an awareness event on 17th May 2025, with the theme “Beat the Heat.” The campaign focused on raising awareness about ways to cope with harsh and humid summer conditions, especially in the context of rising temperatures across the state.
